



## Materials

- A4 sized card (21 x 30cm)
- empty cereal box
- scissors and tape

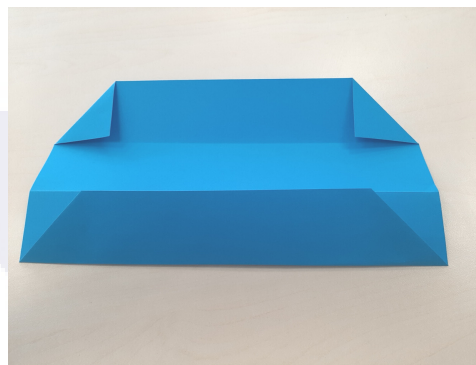
1) Fold paper in half down the long side. Fold up bottom edge so that paper is now a quarter of the size.



2) Crease all folds well.



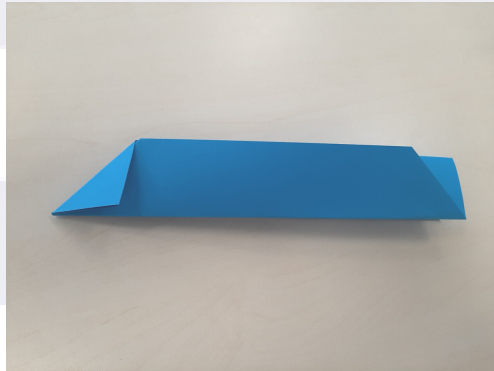
3) Open out paper and then fold in each corner.



4) Fold up each side to create a rectangle.



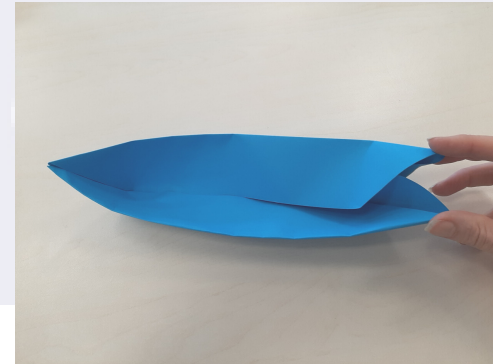
5) Pinch paper together so it folds in half.



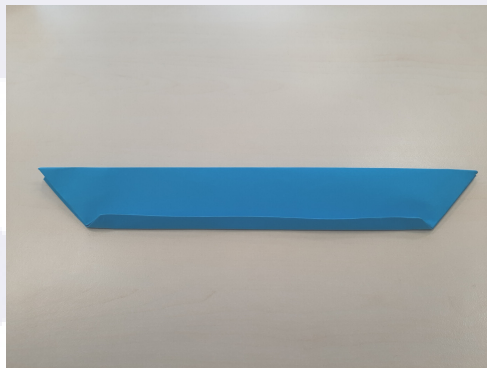
6) Fold down each corner and crease well.



7) Open out paper keeping corners folded in. Fold long edge with corners on the inside.



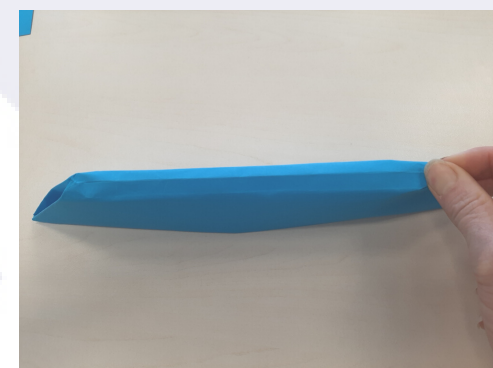
8) Pull ends together tucking short edge with triangle shaped fold under long edge. Fold under opposite side at the other end to ensure edges stay tucked under.



9) Lay your paper flat and fold up 0.5 cm along shorter edge.



10) Open out waka: Press bottom flat and push out sides.



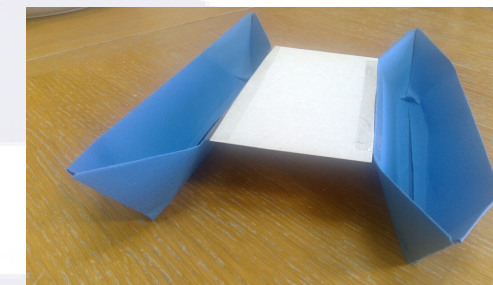
11) Turn over and pinch ends of waka to create a small crease and fold under.



12) Turn over, smooth out and flatten bottom and sides to ensure your waka will be stable.



13) Make a second waka and join both with a piece of cardboard to create a platform.



14) Add details like a shelter, mast and sail using card, ice block sticks or paper. Use plasticine or toys to add kai, tools, or taonga to take on your waka journey.
